
FAUNISTIC RECORDS FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC – 199

Coleoptera: Ptiliidae

Ptiliolum sahlbergi Flach, 1888. Bohemia bor., Pec pod Sněžkou, (5360), 29.vii.1997, 1 ♀, P. Štourač (Praha) lgt. et det., O. Nakládal revid. et coll.; same locality and date, 900 m a.s.l., 2 ♀♀, sifted from hay near feeding rack, P. Štourač lgt., det. et coll.; same locality, 23.vii.2000, 1 ♀, beaten from spruce branches, P. Štourač lgt., det. et coll. Widely distributed throughout Europe and known also from Asia. In Europe known from Austria, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, France, Great Britain, Germany, Italy, Norway, Russia (North European Territory), Poland, Sweden and Switzerland; in Asia reported only from Mongolia (Johnson 2004). In the Czech Republic mentioned from both Moravia and Bohemia by Jelínek (1993), but in the second case as dubious. Occurrence in Bohemia is confirmed.
