

FAUNISTIC RECORDS FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC – 397

Coleoptera: Melandryidae

Dircaea australis Fairmaire, 1856. Bohemia centr., Řevnice (6051), 1979, 1 spec., J. Herrmann lgt., O. Konvička det. et coll. European saproxylic species with discontinuous distribution, known from Austria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Belarus, Croatia, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Hungary, Romania, “Serbia and Montenegro”, Slovakia, Slovenia, Sweden, Switzerland and Ukraine (Nikitsky & Pollock 2008), and also from Spain (Recalde Irurzun & Pérez Moreno 2006), Lithuania (Stanionis & Petrikas 2008), Poland (Kubisz et al. 2010), southwestern Russia (Kovalenko & Nikitsky 2013) and recently, the first concrete record from Montenegro (Konvička 2015). A single record was published from Latvia by Telnov (1996), but the specimen was incorrectly identified (Telnov 2002). In the Czech Republic so far known only from southeastern Moravia from Pohansko near Břeclav (Jelínek 1996), Lanžhot near the confluence of the Morava and Dyje rivers (Schlaghamerský 2000, Schlaghamerský et al. 2008) and Velké Bílovice (Šťastná & Psota 2013). New species for Bohemia.

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
